Acute Gout Treatment Considerations

- NSAIDS
 - Avoid use in the following situations
 - **GFR < 60**
 - hyperkalemia
 - GI ulcer
 - poorly controlled hypertension
 - Uncompensated heart failure
 - NSAID allergy or intolerance
- Oral Glucocorticoids
 - Avoid use in the following situations
 - poorly controlled diabetes
 - wound healing complications post-surgically
 - suspected current infection
- Colchicine
 - Avoid use in the following situations
 - allergy
 - combined renal and hepatic disease
 - Use within 24-36 hrs of a gout attack
 - Consider use with patients on oral anticoagulants that are unable to take NSAIDs
- Intraarticular corticosteroid injections
 - Avoid this treatment option in the following situations
 - > 2 affected joints
 - suspected joint infection

Naproxen 500 mg bid

Indomethacin 50 mg 3x daily
